Hepatitis A Risks

- Household contacts of infected persons
- Sex partners of hepatitis A infected persons
- Persons, especially children, living in regions of the US with consistently elevated rates of hepatitis A
- Persons traveling to countries where hepatitis A is common
- Men who have sex with men
- Injecting and non-injecting drug users

Hepatitis B Risks

- People with more than one sex partner in a 6 month period
- Persons diagnosed with a sexually transmitted disease
- Men who have sex with men
- Sexual contacts of hepatitis B infected people
- People who inject illegal drugs
- Health care and public safety workers who might be exposed to infected blood or body fluids
- Household contacts of persons with chronic hepatitis B infection
- Infants born to infected mothers
- Hemodialysis patients
- Infants/children of immigrants from areas with high hepatitis B rates
